From the Rabbi...

In the coming month, we celebrate Tu B'Shevat and Shabbat. Traditionally the 7th grade religious school students under the leadership of Morah Bain, lead a Tu B'Shevat Seder for the 3rd graders. As we know there is no reference to Tu B'Shevat in the Torah, although there are passages about nature and planting trees. We are told in Leviticus that when we enter "the land" of Israel and plant trees, we shall not eat of them for three years in order that the fruit shall develop properly. The Psalms often draw pictures from nature and describe God's blessings as a tree with deep roots.

In the Talmud, Tu B'Shevat is mentioned as a former folk holiday. Israel was in full bloom and the fruits were beginning to fill the trees. People sent tithes to the Temple in Jerusalem. With the destruction of the second Temple, people living in the land of Israel continued to celebrate Spring with a holiday of nuts and fruits. Tu B'Shevat is still celebrated but for Am Yisrael of the diaspora, we see it as a holiday of renewal and dedication to the environment.

When I think of the many current needs that would assure the future, environment is front and center in my mind. I don't bother listening to the weather report anymore because it is filled with tornados, flooding, freezing in places that do not freeze, flood or experience tornados. It is almost Biblical to read about what is happening all

across this country. There are more bears out and about, because it's not cold enough for them to hibernate. A family in upstate New York called the police because a bear was enjoying their hot tub. People are dying in the flood waters of California. Texas did not know what to do with their snow and most of the state was without electricity, made much longer because they were unprepared for snow storms. If these weather patterns do not scare our leaders as to what the future holds, then the children of the future will be left holding a heavy burden that may not be able to be reversed.

We need to do our part. Solar panels, electric cars, composting, recycling, joining Facebook pages about the environment. Go to the Coejl web-page or Dayenu to learn more about what we, as Jews, can do to prevent the destruction of our earth.

Religious learning:

Tu B'Shevat, one of the four Jewish New Years occurs this month. It is mostly an Israeli holiday to welcome the spring and remind us of renewal and rededication to the earth. Frankly, Israel does a far better job caring for the environment than we do. Perhaps it is because the country is still young or perhaps it is because they live by the rules of the Torah and Talmud, leaving the land fallow every Sabbatical year (7th year). Most of the cars in Israel are electric and families have less cars than we do. Israel is set up to be a walking country. Jerusalem encourages people to use the train from stop to stop. Israel has also accomplished extensive infrastructure, regulatory and institutional reform for recycle 87 percent of their wastewater to address water scarcity issues.

There are six tech companies that address environmental issues: Lumos Global uses solar energy to assure power in all parts of the world, preventing power inequity. Customers pay a one time fee to their local mobile phone provider and in return receive a kit composed of a solar panel, an indoor power unit, phone charging accessories and two red LED lights. The solar panel is easy to install and people who live far away from civilization receive 100 percent clean energy at a small price.

Scodix is a company that provides digital printing presses to all customers all over the world. Their goal is to cut down on the amount of paper that is used around the world. Their centralized printing presses are all made of naturally occurring components - there are no more harsh ink chemicals or plastic cartridges. In a digital world, they eliminate the need for individual printers and paper.

FMX polymers creates flame retardant plastics to use both in the home and in infrastructure. Based on green chemistry, the fmx polymers contain no toxins as compared to plastic which are all toxic. There are much less fires with this polymer and it's safer for everyone.

Prospera is a company that brings agriculture into the 21st century. Using camera and sensors directly in the fields, Prospera collects environmental data which is then used, with their software, to determine what causes plant health, stress and development. The data goes to the farmer's phone and Prospera gives directive to help the field of farming flourish. This does not only help make farming prosperous but helps the farmers to predict trends for the future.

Can you imagine what our country would look like if we had software which was comparable and an infrastructure that could siphon off rain water, drain in instantly and transform it into usable clean water?



Cantor's Corner...



& Notes From The Cantor &

We will soon once again come to a Torah narrative that we usually read in close proximity to Tu B'Shevat, the glorious New Year For The Trees. It is an event that is accompanied in the Torah scroll itself by a special song which Moses sang with all of the Israelites after witnessing a one-time miracle. I am referring to the splitting and crossing of Yam Suf, the Sea of Reeds, or the Red Sea and then the rejoining

of the sea drowning Pharaoh's army rendering safe the freed Hebrews on the other side.

Regarding the biblical event itself, putting aside questions about the physicality of this recorded miracle that Cecil B. DeMille re-enacted on screen, how wide or deep was the sea, what scientific explanations can account for it, whether it can or needs to be proved archaeologically or if it should only be taken as a metaphor, one of the most important aspects about the narrative is that the Hebrews were finally free once and for all of any danger of being overtaken by the Egyptians and either killed or taken back into slavery. They then proceed to sing a song which weaves verses of praise, tempered with a recounting of the fate that befell our Egyptian pursuers. This song contains the oft-recited "Mi Chamocha" prayer in our liturgy. The Shabbat in which we read this Song at the Sea is known as *Shabbat Shirah*, the Sabbath of Song.

Shirat haYam, the Song at the Sea is impossible to miss in the Torah scroll. In a scroll with no vowels or trope marks, one usually needs to look for the opening verses of an assigned portion which may or may not begin at the beginning of a paragraph. With Shirat haYam, however, the Torah text is suddenly spread out in a special formation resembling bricks as follows:

They said, I will sing to the Eternal for God has triumphed God has hurled to the sea. gloriously. Horse and rider, The Eternal is my strength and might and has become my salvation. This is my God, the God of my ancestor. I will enshrine and exalt God. Who is like You among all that is worshipped? Who is like you holy majestic One The Eternal God will reign forever and ever!

An explanation for this alignment of the text to resemble bricks is that the literary devices of Hebrew poetry are compared metaphorically to the laying of bricks to build a house or a firm foundation.

Shabbat Shirah, the Sabbath of Song, this year falls on February 3. We will be accompanied by a band of three talented musicians, Mike Kovacs on Guitar, Jesse Marks on Bass, and Mike Tobin on Keyboard, as we worship God together in the style of a Rock Shabbat. Please join us on Shabbat Shira, the Sabbath of song.
