From the Rabbi...

At the end of the month of December, many people write down New Year's resolutions. I do think that changes that we want to make with guidelines and ways to check if we are going in the right decision are important. The top two resolutions are: win the lottery and lose weight or get into shape. The first is based on pure luck and the second is based on work- usually too much work for people to keep to after several weeks. Instead of writing down a list that may end up in the recycling, really think about the changes and new directions that you would like to take in your life and create a visioning board. My friend who is a bestselling author does this for every book she writes. She begins with the outline of the story- highlighting the arc of the plot right in the middle of a posterboard. With yarn lines in different colors to characters, environment, information about the place and the time and the goal that she wants her readers to come away with. At the top of the board, she has a mockup of the book cover with a title that she knows her publishers will change, a description of the book and on the

back her usual author's photo. As she begins to write and more facts about her characters come to the forefront her vision board takes up the entire wall in her writing room. Only when everything is down does she begin writing.

This should be the same for each of our goals for the coming year. If you make a concrete plan with easy steps, you will get to your goal. Want to change jobs - don't just put the idea into the atmosphere. Determine what you would rather be doing, what type of education would you need to get to this new profession, who could help you along the way.

As a Jewish community, Temple Sha'arey Shalom needs to do the same with a long term and a short-term plan. If we decide to stay together then we need to determine if we will be able to remain at St. James or approach different religious organizations in town. Should we look at homes, knowing that they will need some transformation, and repairs over the years. Do we close? There are many different choices, but we need to do the research to determine if and who we will be in the future. It is a challenging conversation and we have had it repeatedly and now need to do it in the right way if we are to have a long future. We will need each one of you to make a responsible decision as to our future. If we all vote with our hearts, the answer would be a definitive yes. But we need to answer the question with true facts, financial numbers, and numbers of members. I know that if we set realistic goals then attaining them is a true possibility. In the writings of Pirke Avot 3:17, "Without understanding there is no knowledge, and without knowledge, no understanding." Let's move ahead with truth, honesty, and knowledge. May this secular New Year bring you wonderful memories, more opportunities to learn and of course the love of those around you.

Cantor's Corner...



🎵 Notes From The Cantor 🎵

The world of Jewish music just lost another giant. Simon Sargon z"l (1938-2022) was a prolific composer, conductor, arranger, pianist, music director and music educator of Indian-Sephardic, Israeli, and Eastern Ashkenazi descent. (He said in an interview that his mother's side of the family came from either Minsk or Pinsk.) Sargon wrote musical settings to many of our prayers and also a piece billed as a "Jewish Requiem" called "Azkara."

He was born in Mumbai, India, in 1938. Shortly thereafter, his family brought him to the United States. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree at Brandeis University in 1959 and a Masters from Juilliard in 1962. He would also teach at Juilliard, as well as Sarah Lawrence College, Marymount College, the Rubin Academy in Jerusalem, and Southern Methodist University, and serve as Music Director for a lengthy tenure at Temple Emanu-El in Dallas, Texas.

Simon Sargon's Judaic related works included his Elul: Midnight-A Cantata of Penitence (1975), a cantata based on Song of Songs called Flame of the Lord (1978), a piece for orchestra and narrator called Renewing the Covenant (1981), Symphony #1 Holocaust (1985), Psalms of Qumran (1986), A House of All Peoples for Temple B'nai Israel in Oklahoma City, an opera called Saul, King of Israel in 1989, a Sabbath service for Youth Choir called Sing His Praise, a Friday night service called Mizmor L'Toda, and dozens of individual prayer settings. His non-Judaic works include Portraits of Vermeer, for French horn and piano, a three-movement solo piano work called Triptik, a poetry cycle of works by famous poets called Sound the Flute, Janus, a quartet for piano and strings, Divertimento, for piano and orchestra, Implosions, for two pianos, a collection of piano preludes called Mood Swings, his 1988 Blue Mountain Ballads, and a piece called Waves of the Sea. He also wrote A Chorale for Martin Luther King for youth orchestra, a French horn concerto called Questings, and Scott Joplin variations called Dusting Around With Scott's Rag. 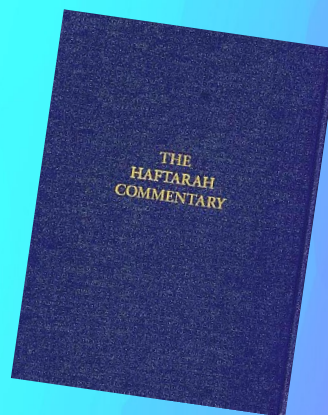
