## From the Rabbi...

"Are we the sum of what we've crossed off our to-do list? Or are we only what we have left to do?" ~ Kate Walbert

The month of Elul is here. I always approach it with two mindsets. I look forward to the new year and the introspection, cheshbon hanefesh/taking account of my soul, that I will do to prepare. But I also get a bit nervous as to what that introspection will uncover, what I will have to face about myself.

Elul is when we look intensely inward at, as some rabbis say, the "ifs" of our lives. If only we had been more loving, more patient, more hopeful. If only we had forgiven rather than harbored anger and resentment. If only we had reached outward and reached inward. If only we hadn't looked away from another in need. If only we hadn't begrudged. If only we hadn't lied. If only.

"In Elul, before eating and sleeping, a person should look into his soul and search his deeds, that he or she may confess." (Rebbe Tarphon)

I use it also as a time to apologize and ask

for forgiveness. And the acknowledgement of where I went wrong and how I will try to get it right the next time - the act of teshuvah/turning back to redo - feel good. It is not an easy process. Sometimes people refuse to accept my apology. And I must live with that. It is the time where I go through my social media and

unfriend people who are toxic, those who I never speak to, those who I don't even know.

My friend Rebekah died mid - August. She had cancer, and when she asked me three years ago if I would officiate her funeral, she left me a list of who to call, who to disinvite to her funeral, and what I should say for her obituary. I told her that the funeral was not for her. It was for her kids and grandkids and all of us who loved her. At her funeral, I found that she used the weeks before she died to call those whom she had hurt, and apologized. She left nothing unsaid. Elul is our rehearsal for death. We are given a month to get closure from others.

Out of this introspection there is inevitably some clarity, realizations of what I have learned and can cross off my to-do list. But with this knowledge, I also realize what I cannot yet cross off my list and what I have discovered about myself that I need to add to my list. Perhaps for many of us life is not clearly delineated; perhaps it's one long list with scratches and erasures and ongoing additions and subtractions; one large fluid list that realistically exemplifies our lives today.

If I do the work from my heart, then maybe I'll be ready to "make a joyful noise unto the Lord!"  $^{\sim}$  Psalm 66

There are many wonderful customs, symbols, and traditions associated with <u>Rosh HaShanah</u>, the Jewish New Year, a time of prayer, self-reflection and repentance.

PREPARING DURING THE HEBREW MONTH OF ELUL

Preparation for both Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur (the "Day of Atonement") customarily begins a full month before the holidays themselves, with the entire Hebrew month of Elul dedicated to reflecting on the past year, and preparing to improving ourselves, our communities, and our world in the coming year.

#### SAYING SPECIAL PRAYERS

<u>Selichot</u> (special penitential prayers) are recited during the month of Elul. A special <u>Selichot</u> service is conducted late in the evening — often by candlelight — on the Saturday night a week before Rosh HaShanah.

#### REFLECTING

It also is a month during which we are encouraged to study and take time for personal reflection around our actions of the past year and to seek forgiveness from those we have wronged or with whom we otherwise have "missed the mark" in our interactions and behaviors. Many readily available resources can help you make this process interactive.

### & Notes from the Cantor &

You are more familiar with the music of Tz'vikah Pik z"l (1949-2022) than you perhaps realize. He was an Israeli pop singer, songwriter, composer, and

television personality. Think of the most popular, most well-known modern setting to the Shehecheyanu blessing that you know.

You are probably thinking about the melody by Tzivikah Pik. Sing along with it here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=-plzCYlhuf4

The same would be true for an upbeat version of Shema that is sung at every Reform Jewish camp in North America. Sing along with it here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rLWDAevAGBI

Tzivikah Pik was born Henryk (Zvi) Pick in Wroclaw, Poland, the son of Borys and Paulina Pick. It was already a very musical family, with his grandfather being the head of a music school and his uncle being a music professor, and Zvikah himself was already studying classical music at age of five. In 1957, his family made aliyah to Israel, and Tzivikah studied music at the Conservatory of Ramat Gan. He became one of Israel's leading pop singers and played a lead part in the Hebrew version of Hair. He wrote several award winning songs for Eurovision. Habima Theater wove several of his songs into a musical called Mary Lou, which was later made into a television series called Tamid Oto Chalom.

Tzivika Pik had three children with Mirit Shem-Or, his first wife, and then two other children with Shira Manor. Mirit continued to collaborate with him in writing songs after they divorced. One of his daughters, Daniella, is married to Reservoir Dogs and Pulp Fiction director Quentin Tarantino. Tzivika lived to be 72 and passed away last month. His music continues to be celebrated.




## B'nai Mitzvahs...

- Dealing with all the college stuff, no pressure.

Be You is free for children of members and \$150 per year for non-members. Classes and pizza are on Thursday Nights from 6-7:30. Be you in a place that treasures who you are.

# Grades 3-5

Students in these grades expand their ability to read Hebrew and learn prayers. They also learn history, holidays, Torah, and tradition. Activities range from cooking Israeli food to creating ritual objects that will be used when they become B'nei Mitzvah.






