From the Rabbi...

Human beings love to count down. Our calendars are marked one week until vacation - usually a reminder to pack and remind ourselves to go over our papers and make sure everything is in order. My daughter, Bailey, is currently counting down to the days that she will return from her first year of college and the twins are waiting anxiously for their senior year.

We are currently counting the Omer in the Jewish calendar. We began counting during Pesach and will end 49 days later on the eve of Shavuot, where we mark receiving the Torah. We are commanded to count these days in a ritual, beginning each night with the blessing and then we say: today is the _____ day of the Omer. Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik teaches that this practice of verbally counting days and weeks reminds us of where we are and where we are going, thus evoking a sense of movement from one state of being to another. Jewish time is purposeful and directed and filled with meaning. Every day presents us with the opportunity to stay where we are or to move forward - in this

case to stand at Sinai again.

Counting the days from the Exodus to receiving the Torah reminds us that with freedom comes responsibility. The ancient Israelites needed to learn the spirituality of freedom to be able to truly receive the Torah.

Counting the Omer in Reform and Conservative Judaism has taken on a deeper spiritual meaning. We move from day to day with intention and a theme. Karen Kedar has written a beautiful book about counting the Omer. She divides the period into weeks with the themes of: decide, discern, choose, hope, imagine and courage. With each day of the week of decide, we receive a quote from a different author to think about, speak about, or journal about.

One of my favorites: "I prayed for wonders instead of happiness, and You gave them to me." Abraham Joshua Heschel. ,

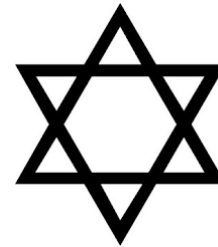
Karen's response, "Never forget that as you proceed along the path, you leave behind traces in the hearts of those you have loved and those you have denied. You leave an impression in the memories of those you have hurt and those you have encouraged; you touch the spirits of those you have embraced and those you have shunned. It is a great responsibility to live. And know, of all the words I have found, kindness is the most powerful. It can transform the world."

To live with kindness, attention, intention. To live with ears wide open to truly listen and with eyes wide open to truly see, even that what seems minute. To live with joy, laughter, tears and all the emotions in between. I have tried to live this way for the past 8 years as spiritual leader of Temple Sha'arey Shalom. On Memorial Day, we will stop the counting of the Omer and celebrate the gift of Torah - Shavuot.

And on June 2nd, Friday night, I will dance with you and sing with you as we come together for my last Shabbat at Temple Sha'arey Shalom. The counting does not end. You continue counting days with Cantor Jason Rosenman and perhaps a new Rabbi and a new

president while I count the days until I begin as the Rabbi of Monmouth Reform Temple in Tinton Falls. And life continues and we grow and move forward because we have no choice. Thank you for loving me and helping me to grow, and dancing with me and allowing me to fully embrace you. My heart is large and it will continue to grow as I hold you all there.

Cantor's Corner...



🎵 Notes From The Cantor 🎵

A while back, I wrote about American Jazz legend Dave Brubeck, as an example of a Gentile who wrote Jewish music. Dave Brubeck had written a major oratorio highlighting some of the shared struggles of the Jewish and African American communities. Dave Brubeck also named his first born son Darius after his esteemed Jewish mentor in Jazz Music Composition. That person was Darius Milhaud (pronounced me-YO). Before he became Dave Brubeck's teacher, mentor, and inspiration, before he wrote such renowned works as *Scaramouche* (the name of a roguish clown character in Italian comedy) and *La Creation Du Monde*, and a host of Jewish works in Europe and in the United States, and before he became one of a prominent group of composers known as Les Six, Darius Milhaud's life story began in Aix -En-Provence, France. He was actually born in Marseilles in 1892, but spent his childhood in Aix-En-Provence and came from a prominent lineage among Provencal Jewry. Apparently, Darius Milhaud's great grand-father was one of the founding members of the synagogue at Aix.

Milhaud started out as a violinist but later turned to composition. From 1917-1919, he served as secretary to Paul Claudel, the French ambassador to Brazil who was also a poet and dramatist, and he set many of Claudel's texts to music. He also took a big interest in Brazilian folk music. However, it was a trip to the US in 1922, which propelled Milhaud's interest in Jazz which became reflected in a 20 minute work called *La Creation Du Monde* ("The Creation of the World") in six movements: 1) Overture, 2) The chaos before creation, 3) The slowly lifting darkness and the creation of trees,

plants, insects, birds, and beasts, 4) Man and woman created, 5) The desire of man and woman, and 6) Man and woman kiss.

He married his wife, Madeleine in 1925 and she bore him a son, Daniel, in 1930, who would grow up to be a painter and sculptor. In 1940, the Milhauds fled from the rise of Nazism and the Vichy government, to Oakland, California, where he secured a teaching post at Mills College.

Neil Levin, the Director of Milken Archive, points out that it was after his experience as a Jewish refugee fleeing to America, and also learning of the murder of many of his relatives, that Darius Milhaud's Jewish works became more frequent. While still in Pre-war Europe, he composed a cycle called *Poemes Juifs* (1916) and several other Jewish works. It was after fleeing to America that Milhaud composed *Cain and Abel*, for narrato NBr, organ, and orchestra; *Candélabre à sept branches*; *David*, an opera written for the Israel Festival; *Saul* (incidental music); *Trois psaumes de David*; *Cantate de Job*; *Cantate de psaumes*, and *Service Sacre*, a full length Shabbat morning service in an oratorio setting; and *Ani maamin: un chant perdu et retrouvé* ("I Believe: A Lost and Recovered Song").

Scaramouche, *La Creation Du Monde*, the very inspirational *Service Sacre*, and many of Milhaud's other works can be found on the internet. I especially recommend *Service Sacre*. The works of Darius Milhaud are important jewels in our vast treasure trove of Jewish music.

- Select a liaison to RAC-NJ to help us support their local work on social justice issues.
- Decide whether to have a virtual membership level and what benefits come with that level.

How can TSS engage you? The more members who are engaged will make TSS more lively. The more lively we are, the more inviting we will be to new members. The more new members we have, the longer we will be able to continue. Each step leads to the next one. The first step is the hardest. Join us on this journey to our best future.
