My heart stretches better than my body does and holds the names and faces of those whom I love. You are all there, each one in a special chamber meant only for you. And when I need you, and I will, your email, your phone numbers will appear on my phone screen and you will hear me. I am like an elephant. I never forget.

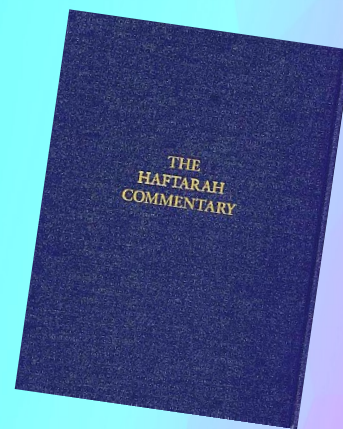
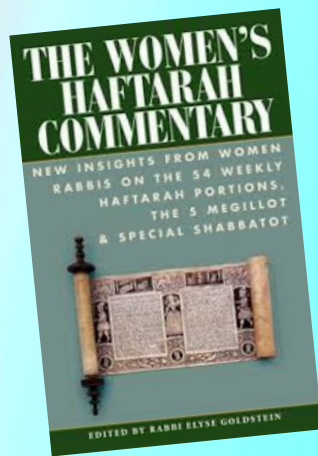

Cantor's Corner...



🎵 Notes From The Cantor 🎵

Normally I use this space to write about an aspect or composer of Jewish music. As we go through a transitionary period together as a community, I would like to take the time to reflect on two words to help us as we move forward. They are "ruach" and compassion. "Ruach" is a Hebrew word that means both "spirit" and "wind." It's synonym, "neshamah," in parallel fashion, also has two meanings. "Neshama" means both "soul" and "breath."

The second verse in the entire Torah states, "v'ruach E-lo-heem m'rachefet al p'ney hamayeem." (Genesis 1:2) Some translations of this render, "and the spirit of God hovered over the surface of the waters." Others render, "and a wind from God hovered over the surface of the waters." Whichever way it is translated, something called "ruach" stirred up that water and made its surface ripple. "Ruach" is also a word used to describe an often desired lively quality in Jewish music. I would argue that this description is not limited to a certain fast tempo or even a certain genre within the repertoire of our people. A slow ballad rendered with emotional depth can be just as stirring and filled with ruach as a horah dance, or a song with a lot of clapping.

I would like to share a talmudic passage that is found in our liturgy. It is usually part of a morning service in the prayerbook but you have also heard it rendered during our High Holy Day services. It is on page 44 of Mishkan Tefilah These are things that are limitless, of which a person enjoys the fruit of the world, while the principal remains in the world to come. They are: honoring one's father and mother, engaging in deeds of compassion, arriving early for study, morning and evening, dealing graciously with guests, visiting the sick, providing for the wedding couple,

accompanying the dead for burial, being devoted in prayer, and making peace among people. But the study of Torah encompasses them all. These words from Mishnah Peah describe in large part, the goings-on of a Temple.

While the passage concludes that the study of Torah encompasses them all, a word in the middle provides what the great sage Hillel would consider to be the key to the whole Torah. That word is "compassion". It paraphrases what Hillel said, "while standing on one foot" is "the whole Torah (and) the rest is commentary (so) go and learn it."

Sing speaking of compassion, I would like to thank Rabbi Renee Edelman for all of the kindness that she has shown me and my entire family, as well as for all of the inspiration, guidance, learning, and support during the five years that we have worked together. My family and I wish her and the Edelman family much joy and mazal as she journeys onward with her new community.

To the congregation and its leaders at Temple Shaarey Shalom, I look forward to the continuation of our learning, honoring, engaging, caring, praying, assembling, and supporting together through joys and sorrows.

May we all go, with ruach and compassion, from strength to strength.

From the President...



Dear Temple Family,

It has been an honor to serve as your president these last three years. It has been a difficult period for our Temple. We were homeless and virtual when I began as president.

By summer's end we found temporary space at CBI in Millburn. We had an office, a chapel for services and classrooms for our religious school. There were restrictions but we were able to begin in-person services and religious school classes. We also were finally able to clean out Roberta's garage and basement and hold our Tricky Tray which had originally been scheduled for the week after the country lockdown.

All the while we were searching for a more permanent home. We connected with Father David Santos, the new Pastor at St James, and that enabled us to rent Hatcher Hall for the High Holy Days last fall and subsequently the entire main floor of the vacant school building. It was a temporary home but we had more space and did not have the restrictions we had at CBI. More importantly, we were back in Springfield!!

We held a Rock Shabbat and Shabbat Shira with special musicians. We planned events to celebrate our new home, Chanukah, Tu B'Shevat, Purim and Passover. Rabbi Renee began a Haftarah study class. Cantor did a class on Jewish Film Composers and another on Ladino/Sephardic Folk Song and Art Song. Rabbi Goldstein held a series of classes both in Temple and on Zoom. Rabbi Renee's last Haftarah class was held in the Temple and on Zoom. Sisterhood plans to have their June meeting in Temple. All the activities held in person have reinforced the community aspect of our Temple and decreased the isolation caused by connecting only via Zoom.

We continued our search for a more permanent home since our lease at St James ends on August 6. We found a great space in Springfield. It is in the 871 Mountain Avenue office building in Springfield. It was a space that required no expensive construction. It has enough office space for our clergy and staff. It has a large open space where we could have our services and oneg shabbat. It also has a small kitchen. It is easily accessible as there are no stairs or curbs to enter the building and we are on the ground floor. We were excited when the landlord was willing to lease to us. Because it is not zoned for religious services, we have filed the papers for a variance. We appear before the Township Board of Adjustment on June 20th and will know that day if we are approved. Since most of our activities take place after normal business hours, we believe we will not cause a noise or a parking problem for the other companies in the building.

As I end my presidency, I want to thank all those who have been helpful in keeping Temple Sha'arey Shalom running. Sandy, who may only be in the office twice a week, but works every day from home checking her emails and phone messages to make sure any problem or emergency gets addressed. Cindy insures our bills are paid and keeps the records which are reviewed by our CPA, Mickey Herzlinger. Our co-treasurers, Laura and Ron Weening, meet with Cindy and come every week to sign the checks. The Temple Board who never complained when I added special meetings. Sisterhood who continued to purchase the paper goods and treats we serve at our onegs. Pam Bain has worked non-stop since we began cleaning out 78 South Springfield Avenue. She is the original Energizer Bunny. In addition to her Ritual duties, she taught Religious School, she took on the position of financial secretary, parliamentarian, worked with the insurance company, wrote contracts for staff, worked with Father David on our contracts with St. James, and helped train ushers. Pam, Ellen Lieberman and Roberta Krumholz have all offered me help as past presidents. Sue Marcus has continued the Saturday morning minyan study group. Brad Sklar has been our main usher and helped clean up after the oneg. Roz and Bob Rosenhanst have assisted me in cleaning up and locking up since we were at CBI. Bob's handiness has extended the direct connection to the internet in Hatcher Hall, set us up to use the smart board in the classrooms at St. James and had the equipment that allowed us to show the movie we viewed on Yom HaShoah to those on Zoom as well. Pat Hurwitz, Dayle Treece and Amy Kass have helped plan, set-up, purchase the food and clean-up for our big special events. Last but not least, I want to thank the Rabbi and Cantor who persevered through the lockdown period and never complained even when attendance was higher on Zoom than attendance in-person. Every week they were there to feed our spirit and teach us.

Please forgive me if I left you out. My computer asks me if I really want to delete a certain file, but my brain is not as thoughtful and makes its own decisions on what to delete.

May Temple Sha'arey Shalom continue to inspire our members to maintain that community and nurture each other. May Bill be as lucky as I was.

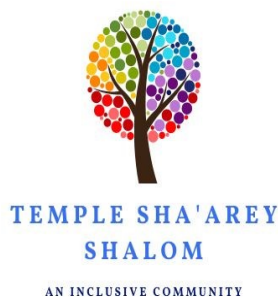
